At a very early age, children begin to explore and interact with the world around them. Creating a safe, structured, and responsive space in which they can do so is critical for their development. First, however, teachers must understand the basic principles of behavior management and how to set up effective inclusive early childhood classroom environments. They must also know how to support dual language learners (DLL) and their families.
