



ADHD/Learning Disability: Happy Feet (Movie) Est. Time: 2 Hours Viewing/45 Minutes Class

Objective

Develop a better understanding of individuals with disabilities and how they are sometimes viewed by members of their families and communities.

Synopsis

Unlike his fellow penguins, Mumble has no Heartsong, "[T]he voice you hear inside...who you truly are," and the song that will one day help him to attract a mate. Instead, Mumble's personality is reflected through his tap dancing, which he calls his "happy feet." Though ostracized by the other penguins, Mumble sets off on a dangerous journey to save the colony from starvation.
