



Hearing Impairment (Deafness): Wired for Sound (Non-Fiction) Est. Time: 2 Weeks Reading/45 Minutes Class

Objective

Gain a better understanding of the challenges of being deaf and of varying attitudes toward cochlear implants.

Synopsis

Beverly Biderman recounts her journey through progressive hearing loss, which resulted in profound deafness by the time she was twelve years old. In a candid and no-nonsense style, she describes in detail the trials, frustrations, and exhaustion of adapting to a hearing world, both with and without a cochlear implant.
