



Traumatic Brain Injury: Regarding Henry (Movie) Est. Time: 2 Hours Viewing/45 Minutes Class

Objective

Gain a better understanding of the challenges sometimes faced by individuals that experience a traumatic brain injury (TBI).

Synopsis

Henry Turner, a wealthy, arrogant, win-at-all-costs, highly successful lawyer, seemed to have it all: a perfect wife, a perfect daughter, a perfect life. Everything changed, however, when Henry was shot during a holdup resulting in a traumatic brain injury. In the process of relearning the most basic skills—walking, reading, getting dressed in the morning—Henry realized he was no longer the person he was before the incident.

- 6. How did family support impact Henry's rehabilitation?
