



Visual Impairment: Fox River (Novel) Est. Time: 2 Weeks Reading/45 Minutes Class

Objective

Gain a better understanding of the impact a visual impairment can have on individuals and their families.

Synopsis

Set in Virginia, this novel revolves around aristocracy, horses, murder, and relationships. During a ride, Julia Warwick falls from her horse and loses her sight. Diagnosed with hysterical blindness, Julia not only learns to adapt to her new environment but also to explore issues and relationships that affect her disability.
