



# Visual Impairment: Scent of a Woman (Movie) Est. Time: 2 Hours Viewing/45 Minutes Class

### Objective

Explore how individuals with a visual impairment are sometimes portrayed in media.

#### Synopsis

To earn extra money over the Thanksgiving holiday, Charlie—a student at an exclusive preparatory school in New Hampshire—agrees to look after a blind veteran named Lt. Col. Frank Slade. Frank, a cantankerous and cynical bully, completely surprises Charlie with tickets to New York and big plans for a wild weekend.

- 1. What common mistake does Charlie make several times as he tries to help Frank get around?
- 2. How do you think Frank's loss of sight impacts his behavior or mood?
- 3. Explain the relationship between Frank's disability and his depression.
- 4. Imagine that you are a member of Frank's family.
  - a. What would you do to help prevent or mitigate his depression?
  - b. What additional support systems do you think would be beneficial?
- 5. Frank's blindness does not seem to limit his ability to do whatever he wants.
  - a. In your opinion, which parts of the movie realistically portray an individual who is blind?
  - b. Which parts of the movie are Hollywood-style exaggerations?
