Frustration and anxiety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Extended time to complete task (generally 1.5 to 2 times the amount typically permitted)</li> <li>Frequent breaks</li> <li>Multiple sessions to complete tests or activities</li> <li>Break large assignments into smaller tasks</li> <li>Timeline for completing assignment</li> <li>Schedule change</li> </ul>
Managing time	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Break large assignments into smaller tasks</li> <li>Timeline for completing assignment</li> <li>Time limit for completing assignment</li> <li>Timer</li> </ul>
