Implementation Steps

1. Teacher: Select and define unfamiliar and familiar words; write sample sentences.
2. Teacher and students: Practice word identification.
3. Teacher and students: Generate student-friendly definitions.
4. Students: Compose sentences.
5. Students: Read text.
6. Students: Evaluate, discuss, and revise sentences.

Passage: Identify the text and the page numbers containing the unfamiliar and familiar words.
