



# Perceptions of Disability: A Smile as Big as the Moon (Non-Fiction) Est. Time: 2 Weeks Reading/45 Minutes Class

## **Objective**

Gain a better understanding of the obstacles students with disabilities sometimes encounter when seeking extra-curricular opportunities.

## Synopsis

After ten years, Mike Kersjes, a special education teacher, was showing signs of burnout. When he came across an article about NASA's space camp, he was inspired to apply for a spot at the camp for his students with disabilities. In this book, Kersjes describes the rejection and resistance he and his students experienced along their journey to attend space camp.

- 4. What factors helped the students succeed at space camp?
- 5. What awards did the students win?
- 6. Discuss your initial perception of the students in the book. Did your perceptions change as you continued to read? If so, how?
